### GRADUATE COURSE IN HYDROLOGY

The School of Civil Engineering of the University of New South Wales has conducted a graduate course in hydrology each year since 1960. The next course will commence on 14 March 1977 and will last for three months on a full-time basis. The 1977 course will be similar to those of recent years, and students can elect to specialize either in surface-water hydrology or in groundwater hydrology.

These courses are suitable for engineers, surveyors, agricultural scientists, meteorologists, foresters, soil conservationists and hydro-geologists, and are particularly convenient for students who are unable to spend one or two years in Sydney to complete normal graduate courses in hydrology. Admission requirements for the course are a first degree in engineering or science or, alternatively, similar qualifications together with suitable experience in the field of hydrology.
